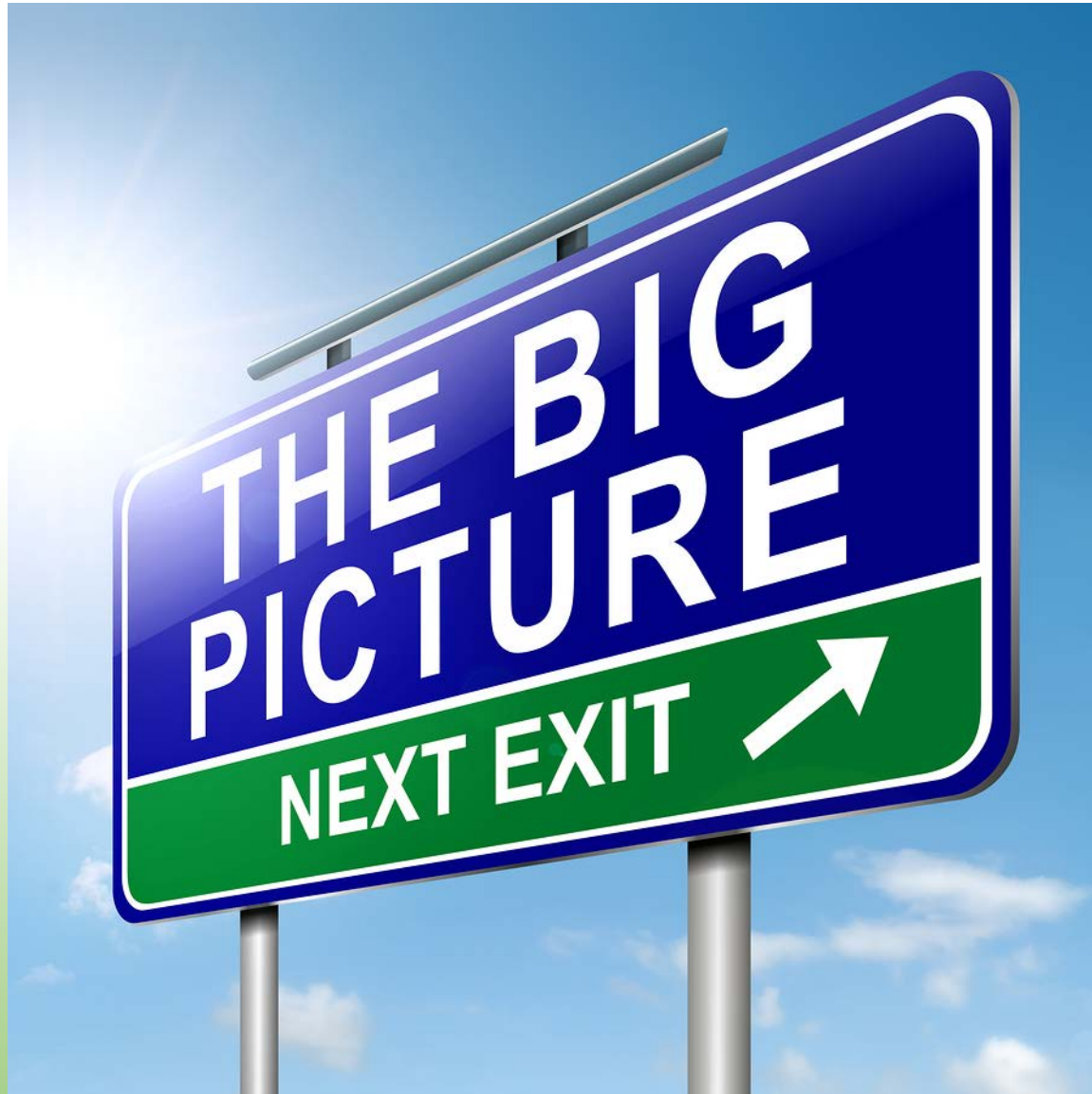

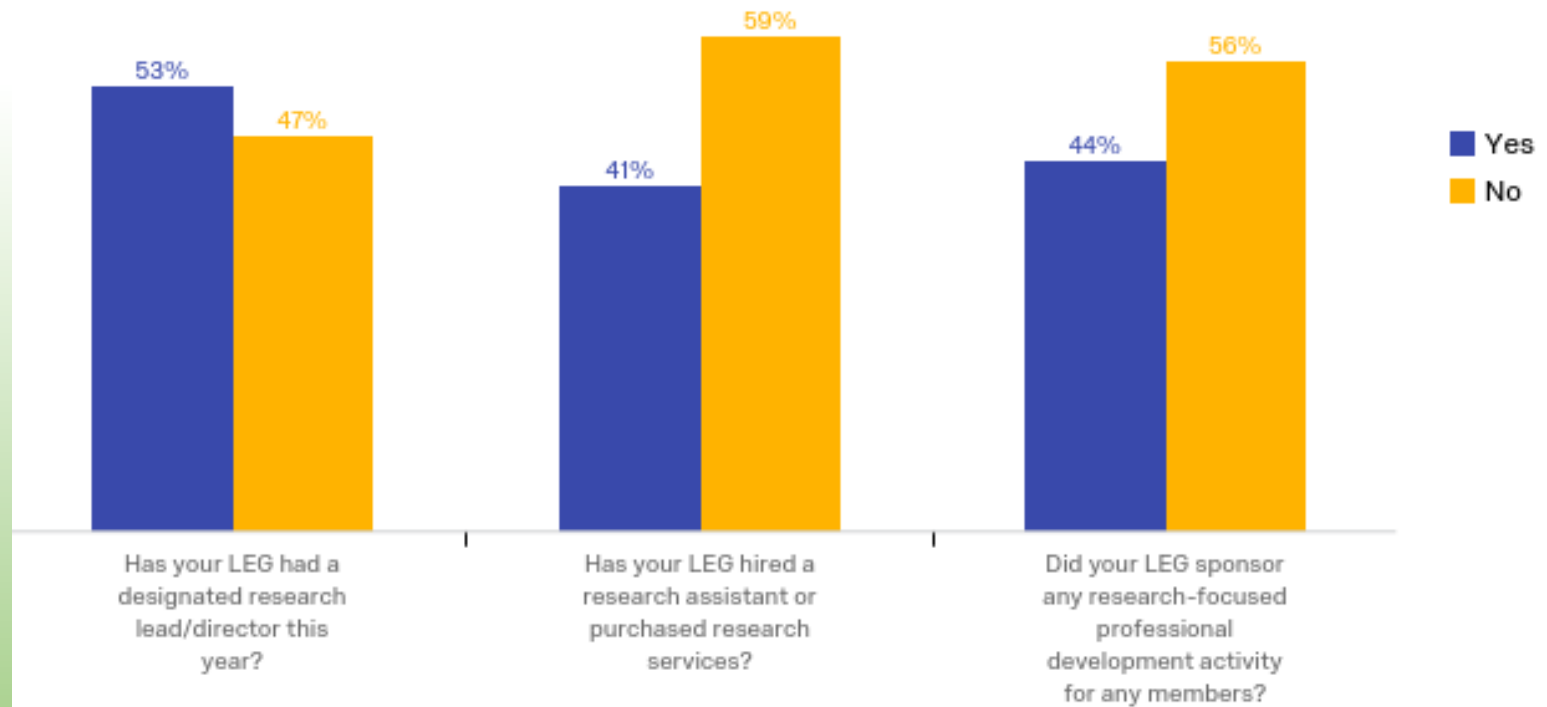

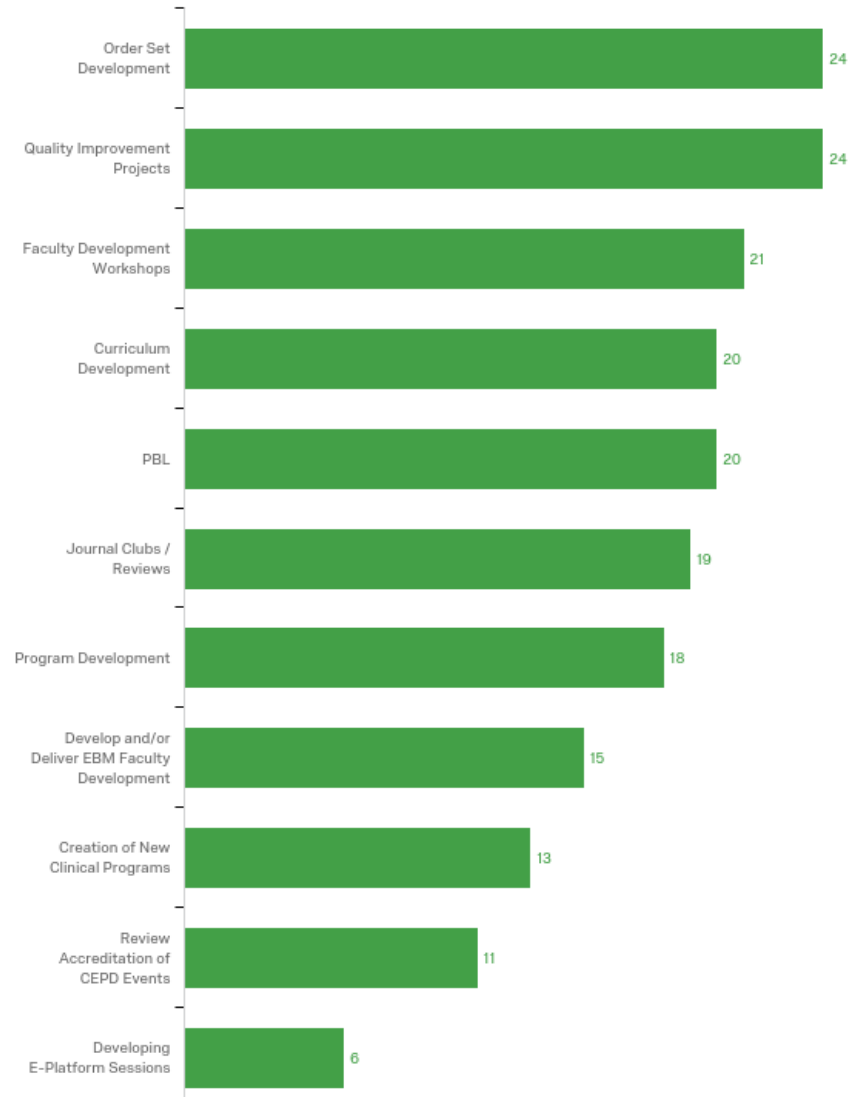
Big Picture – Trend Analysis



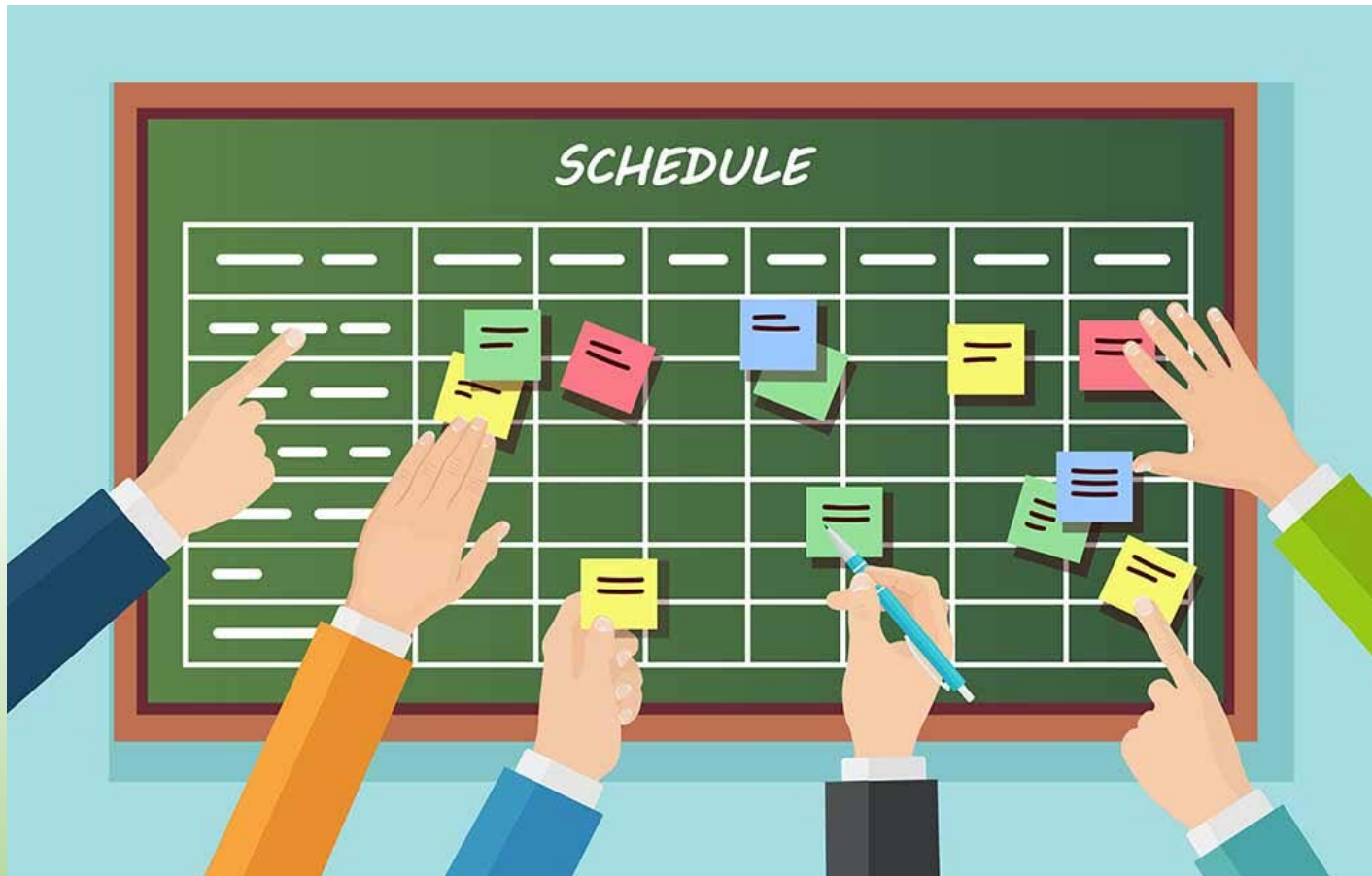

Can support ADDITIONAL clinical teaching weeks	We have had 3 new LEG members join who have recently receive Faculty Appointments and therefore we have further capacity for learners. Our current members still have capacity for more learners.
Can support ADDITIONAL clinical teaching weeks	Better organization of the Elliot lake Local Education group have allowed more efficient use of resources and allow for increased capacity and number of clinical teaching weeks.
Can support ADDITIONAL clinical teaching weeks	<p>There are 3 physicians currently working with learners in Primary Care on a regular basis. There is 1 physician who is gradually increasing his clinical teaching. We currently accept 2-3 learners per block in primary care but we will more consistently be able to accommodate 3 learners per block over the next year.</p> <p>We have availability for learners looking specifically for "Care of the Elderly" with a physician whose practice is exclusively care of frail, elderly patient's living in the community.</p> <p>We have availability to accept medical learners and residents looking for Rural Emergency Department experience as a part of their Family Medicine, Rural Family Medicine and Emergency Medicine Blocks.</p>

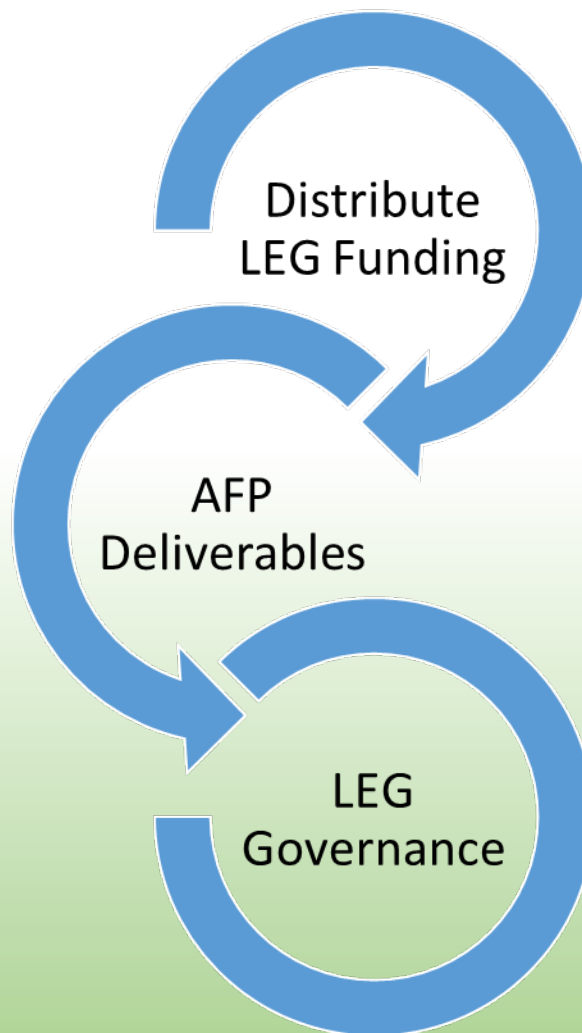
LEGs Interested in Collaborating with other LEGs

Our LEG in general is interested in collaborating with other family physicians, specialists, and allied health professionals to increase the knowledge base of our LEG in order to become better physicians and teachers.
