




Are their Benefits to SIM Learning?



- Simulation improves learned skills (Grantcharov et al. 2004)
- Simulation improves guideline adherence (Shavet et al. 2007)
- Residents trained by simulation performed ACLS skills in clinical settings better than those without simulation practice (Wayne et al. 2008)
- Anesthesia residents trained with Simulation outperformed colleagues in intraoperative settings (Bruppacher et al. 2010)


- When:
 - During orientation week
- Facilitator:
 - SIM Lab Coordinator
- Purpose:
 - Get to know the SIM Lab
 - Chance to ask questions
- Skills:
 - ACLS





Bootcamp

- When:
 - The week after orientation
- Facilitator:
 - SLC and Physicians
- Purpose:
 - Ensure all students have a chance to practice necessary skills for beginning CCC rotation
- Skills Focus:
 - ACLS rhythm interpretation
 - NRP
 - Obstetrics
 - Focused physical exams







Ongoing Workshops

- When:
 - Once per month
- Facilitator:
 - Physician
- Purpose:
 - Practice skills
 - Try skills not seen in clinic
- Skills focus:
 - Airways
 - Obstetrics
 - Trauma
 - Pediatric emergencies
 - Respiratory emergencies







Students as Teachers


- When:
 - 2 times per academic year
- Facilitator:
 - CCC Students with a resident or faculty physician
- Purpose:
 - Show high school students the process of managing a trauma patient
- Skills:
 - Suturing
 - Casting
 - Airways
 - Diagnostic Imaging







Focus on Physician Learning





SIM Lab Teaching Sessions

- When:
 - 2 Sunday's per month from 4-6pm
 - drop-in
- Facilitator:
 - Hired a SIM coordinator
- Purpose:
 - Give physicians a chance to practice skills as a team, debrief
- Skills:
 - Pediatrics
 - Airways
 - Ultrasound
 - Trauma
 - Sepsis






Conclusion

- Simulation activities are a great way to acquire or maintain clinical skills
- Can improve communication skills among team members
- Provides an opportunity to practice low volume skills in a low pressure situation
- Allows for in the moment feedback and the ability to "try again"
